

<b>Education Development</b>	<b>Development of countywide district, training programs and human capital.</b>
<b>Entrepreneurial Development</b>	<b>Resource development for potential entrepreneurs.</b>
<b>Environmental Restoration</b>	<b>Clean-up and redevelopment of brownfield properties.</b>
<b>Health Information &amp; Services</b>	<b>Feasibility study for small clinic to operate in Hughes.</b>
<b>Infrastructure Development</b>	<b>Improvement of all infrastructure, including telecommunications.</b>
<b>Parks &amp; Recreation</b>	<b>Development of publicly owned properties into recreation facilities.</b>
<b>Senior Citizen Activity Center</b>	<b>Establishment of a community center with activities for our seniors.</b>
<b>Value-added Agriculture</b>	<b>Development of local growers to provide healthy food.</b>
